COVID-19 CAMPUS PROTOCOL



Face Covering Practices

GETTING STARTED



LUNCH

Full day campers should arrive to camp with a bag lunch, beverage and 2 snacks. Refrigeration is not provided, pack food that is safe to store at room temperature. Lunches should be ready-to-eat as campers may not have access to a microwave or vending machines. All campers will eat in the PGCC Hollow Tree where they will be supervised by college staff.

The College cannot provide an environment free of foods containing nuts.

LATE PICK UP FEES

A \$1.00 late fee is charged per minute. Cash payment is due at time of pick up.

REFUND POLICY

Refunds will be issued if campers are dropped ten days prior to the course start date. If a course is canceled due to insufficient enrollment, refunds are automatically mailed/credited within ten days of official cancellation.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

REGISTER CAMPERS FOR HIGHEST GRADE COMPLETED

Courses are designed for campers who have completed grades 2-8 during the current school year. All courses meet Monday through Friday, with the exception of July 4th. Owl Scholars offers academic and interest-based activities in a college setting. We welcome campers' curiosity, creativity, laughter, and positive attitude.

NOTE: ALL ACADEMIC COURSES require an assessment prior to the start of camp.

ACADEMICS

YTH-434 Language Arts Elementary (Grades 2-5)

A course with creative, interactive, and engaging strategies to help campers strengthen important reading and writing skills learned during the school year. Through gaming and other techniques, youth will practice capitalization, punctuation, and language mechanics, sentence structure, language usage, spelling, vocabulary, and comprehension.

\$375 (includes \$155 materials fee)

YTH-443 Language Arts Middle (Grades 6-8)

A creative and interactive course with engaging strategies to help campers strengthen important reading and writing skills learned during the school year. Faculty will use discourse and decision-making to maintain skills as it relates to inference, cause/effect, important details, main idea, sequencing, authors purpose, prefixes, suffixes, multiple-meaning words, capitalization, spelling, and punctuation.

\$375 (includes a \$155 materials fee)

YTH-432 Math Elementary (Grades 2-5)

A creative and interactive course with engaging strategies to help campers strengthen important mathematical concepts learned during the previous school year. Through various techniques, campers will practice patterns and problem-solving of addition, subtraction, money, time, fractions, measurement, and multiplication.

\$415 (includes a \$175 materials fee)

YTH-448 Math: Basic Math (Grades 6-7)

This course provides creative, interactive, and engaging strategies to help campers strengthen mathematical concepts learned during the previous school year. Faculty will use various techniques to strengthen campers understanding of place value, comparing and ordering numbers, addition, and subtraction facts, estimation, one- and two-digit divisors and multipliers, geometric figures, decimals, fraction and percentages.

\$415 (includes a \$175 materials fee)

YTH-449 Math: Pre-Algebra (Grades 6-8)

This course focuses on reviewing pre-algebra/algebra concepts learned during the previous school year. Faculty will use creative, interactive, and engaging strategies to reinforce pre-algebra concepts of variable recognition, signed numbers, formulas, and single-variable equations. Algebraic symbolism, simplifying expressions, solutions to elementary equations, and the graphic representations associated with variables are also covered in this course. **Prerequisite: Completion of pre-algebra.**

YTH-570 Art: Sketch, Color, Cut & Paste (Grades 2-8)

FINANCE

YTH-584 Financial RealityStore (Grades 5-8)

Students apply decision-making, problem-solving, and management processes to develop and follow a spending plan to meet established goals. The goal is to develop the knowledge and skills needed to use these processes in practical, real-life situations involving the use of money. They visit a series of learning stations that require making budgeting decisions.
