A. Qualifying Students

The Washington Adventist University minimum residency requirement for a baccalaureate degree is 30 semester credits (15 upper division).
- 4. The Receiving Institution shall designate, and shall provide to the Sending Institution, the contact information for a staff person at the Receiving Institution who is responsible for the oversight of the transfer of Qualifying Students.
