# SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

The Prince George's Community College Institutional Scholarship Program has been established to reward current students who demonstrate high academic ability and assist them in continuing to attend Prince George's Community College. A scholarship committee will select recipients from among those who meet the eligibility requirements and who are committed to attending Prince George's Community College.

**Students must have filed the FAFSA by March 1, 2018**

**FAFSA school code: 002089**

## Application Instructions

1. Login to the online scholarship system using your PGCC OwlLink username and password.
2. Complete the general application (first and last name, student ID, etc.).
3. List academic honors or awards received and major college extracurricular and community activities in which you have been involved.
4. Describe any community service of which you have participated.
5. Submit a minimum of two unique recommendation letters.
6. Provide a concise statement (200–300 words) explaining why you should be selected as a recipient of the scholarship you are seeking and what you expect to achieve from your professional and educational goals at Prince George's Community College.
7. All file uploads must be in either MS Word or Adobe PDF format and saved as '.doc' or '.pdf' files. Filenames for uploads must not exceed 15 characters in length.
8. Only online applications submitted through Academic Works will be accepted. Incomplete applications will not be accepted. It is the applicant's responsibility to review the application for completeness and errors, and to ensure that it adheres to all instructions.

9. Applicants are responsible for submitting all required sections and documents prior to the deadline.

## Scholarship Applicant Reminders

Please read this section carefully before proceeding with the scholarship application process.

1. Be aware of all scholarship restrictions/criteria.
2. Scholarships will be awarded over two semesters (fall and spring) unless otherwise stated.
3. Utilize the Prince George's Community College Writing Center to help prepare your scholarship essay or see the tips provided in the "Scholarship Essay Writing: Secrets of Success" on page 3.

## If Awarded a Scholarship...

Prince George's Community College scholarships are made possible through the generosity of donations from several individuals and organizations. Therefore, each recipient must produce a "thank you" letter to their respective donor. Failure to comply may render the applicant ineligible to receive scholarship awards for the current semester.

Recipients may also be asked to attend a donor appreciation event and provide community service hours to the college.

# SCHOLARSHIP ESSAY WRITING

The scholarship essay is one of the most important components of the scholarship application process. Below are some tips for success, courtesy of the Prince George's Community College Writing Center.

## Plan Your Essay Carefully

Start out with a sound plan for your essay. Be sure you've done all your prewriting before you start to write.

## State Your Thesis

Yes, like any essay, a scholarship essay has a thesis! State that you are writing to apply for the scholarship (state the name of the scholarship). Unlike most essays, this one does not need an entire introductory paragraph—remember, you only have 200–300 words.

## Organize

There are four sections to an essay: the introductory sentences, two supporting body paragraphs, and the concluding paragraph.

1. In the first supporting body paragraph, explain why you should be selected as a recipient of the scholarship you are seeking.
2. In the second supporting body paragraph, explain what you expect to achieve in terms of your professional and/or educational goals at Prince George's Community College.

## Support

Each of these paragraphs will include:

1. A topic sentence that shows the point of the paragraph.
2. Details that support the point.

## Be Specific!

In both of your supporting paragraphs, use specific details that illustrate to the reader who you are and what makes you special as a candidate. Don't make general statements such as, "I plan to use my college education to get a good job." Instead, state specifics, "I plan to use my concentration in pre-law to become a corporate litigator for a Fortune-500 company." Show that you have done your research, both about your academic concentration at Prince George's Community College and about your future plans.

## Concluding Paragraph

Sum up the point of your essay in one sentence and thank the reader for his/her attention.

## Be Human!

Come across as the interesting, unique individual that you are! If you've had any distinguishing circumstances in your life—for example, if you have come from another country, have had hardships growing up or have been particularly inspired by people or events in your life—don't be afraid to mention them.

## Edit Your Essay Carefully!

Be sure that your essay is meticulously edited: It should be clear, concise, detailed, grammatical, free of typographical errors, and interesting.

Minimum cumulative 3.0 high school GPA and SAT score of at least 1150 on the critical reading and mathematics section, **or** a minimum cumulative 3.25 high school GPA and SAT score of at least 1050 on the critical reading and mathematics section **or** minimum cumulative 3.25 high school GPA and a minimum combined score of 203 on the Accuplacer reading and sentence structure, **and** a 45 in college mathematics, or an ACT score of at least 23.

Submission of the Board of Trustees Legacy Scholarship application, a 200–300 word essay explaining why you should be chosen as a Board of Trustees Scholarship recipient, two letters of recommendation, and a list of co-curricular and Legacy community activities are required.
