

PRINCE GEORGE'S COMMUNITY COLLEGE AND UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND, COLLEGE PARK INSTITUTIONAL ARTICULATED PATHWAY AGREEMENT

AGREEMENT

This Articulation Agreement serves as the formal collaboration document for Prince George's Community College (PGCC) and the University of Maryland, College Park (UMD) at the Universities at Shady Grove to deliver a seamless pathway between designated Associate degree programs and Bachelor degree programs. The approved pathway is included as a separate appendix to this agreement.

PROVISIONS OF THE AGREEMENT

1. The institutions agree to follow the joint program curriculum and approved course-by-course articulation delineated in these documents.
2. Both educational institutions will cooperate toward developing, disseminating, and presenting the articulated program information to students.
3. Graduates of PGCC who have: 1) successfully completed the approved PGCC degree program, 2) are enrolled in PGCC in good standing, and 3) and are accepted for admission to UMD will be admitted in accordance with UMD's Transfer Student Policy. Students transferring to UMD who have completed their general education requirements at another Maryland public institution of higher education will be considered to have completed their general education requirements with the exception of an upper-level writing course and any additional credits necessary to complete the minimum number of general education credits.
4. Students intending to transfer should apply for admission by the priority deadline for the semester for which they intend to enroll.
5. Students are subject to all the policies and procedures of both institutions while enrolled at those institutions.
6. This articulation agreement is based on the present curricula contained in the appendix. Changes to and the addition of new curriculum can be made without completing the signatory process. The degree requirements will be reviewed biennially; the agreement will be reviewed every five years at which time the agreement can be renewed or ended upon the mutual written consent of both parties.
7. Both institutions at any time may initiate changes to this articulation agreement. Changes should be shared in written format executed by both parties, via email or USPS, with at least 30-day's notice for implementation. The contact at PGCC will be the Office of the Executive Vice President & Provost for Teaching, Learning & Student Success; the contact at UMD will be the School of Public Health Office of the Dean.
8. Notwithstanding any other provision of this articulation agreement, all information relating to student educational records shall be treated in accordance with the Federal Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).
9. This agreement goes into effect for the Fall 2019 semester.
