Philosophy of SLOA at PGCC

Assessment with a direct impact in the classroom

- Course outcomes linked to higher-level outcomes
- Course sequencing and mapping
- Regular process to update outcomes and connections

Authentic assessment that is valuable for faculty and students

- Assessments designed by faculty
- Assessments included in students' grade
- Common assignments assessed with the same assessment tool

Assessment process led by faculty

- Data collection in the hands of faculty
- ·Assessments reviewed by peers
- Assessment policy and guidelines set and updated by faculty

Assessment Academy

The Assessment Academy is a three-level training sequence designed to raise awareness and increase faculty knowledge about assessment theory, how to apply effective assessment design, and how learning outcomes assessment is carried out at PGCC. The Assessment Academy program is open to all faculty members at PGCC on a voluntary basis.



Assist faculty at the department level


Oversees and coordinates the process

Assessment Cycle

Prince George's Community College has a five-year cycle for completing the assessment of every program outcome and every Student Core Competency. This means that program-required courses that meet program outcomes, including capstone courses, will be assessed within five years. Additionally, high-enrollment general education courses that align with the Student Core Competencies are assessed within five years. For each course, the following sequence applies:



How SLOA Works in Practice

- Assessment tools are developed by faculty and reviewed by the Teaching and Learning Assessment Committee (TLAC)
- Assessment tools are used for grading and assessment
 - The assignment used for the assessment is worth at least 15% of the student's total grade
 - Faculty enter assessment data and grade assignments simultaneously using Tk20 and Benchmark Scanners
 - Department Assessment Teams (DATs), comprised of two to three faculty members coordinate data collection and use of results in the department
- The Research, Assessment, and Effectiveness (RAE) office produces Assessment Reports
