Prince George's County residents are given priority for admissions. See the College Catalog for information about out-of-county admissions. Out-of-state students are only considered for admission when the available seats are not filled by qualified Maryland residents. **Students attending the college on a non-domiciliary visa, as determined by the college, will not be considered for admission in any of these programs. To participate in clinical education courses, all students accepted into any of these programs must have a social security number, which will be verified as part of the background check. All students in the health science clinical programs require a criminal background check, drug screen, and health insurance.** Continued participation in each program is contingent upon a satisfactory response on the background check and drug screen. All background check and drug screen information remains confidential and is only shared with the requesting clinical agencies. If a clinical agency denies clinical placement for a student because of a background check, drug screen, or lack of health insurance, that student may not be able to complete the clinical program.

- ✓ Students must complete Developmental and ESL courses in Math, Composition, and Reading if required.
- ✓ **All science courses must be within 10 years of petitioning and ATI-TEAS is required (Proficient or higher with 70% in Reading)**
- ✓ **All students must read the Additional Information section on the back of this document.**
- ✓ Students must have an active unencumbered Maryland LPN License (or Compact License from another state), with a minimum of 6 months or more of employment. (Students must have an active LPN Licence Number)

- **The Allied Health and Nursing Petitioning Advisors** are Ms. Nicole Stubbs and Ms. Tamika McKelvin. They will you know when you should complete the ATI-TEAS exam. **Do not take the exam before meeting with them.**
- **Deadline to petition:**
 - *The Allied Health and Nursing Petitioning Advisors petition a year in advance.*
 - Fall petition deadline and ATI- TEAS scores are due by April 1.
 - Spring petition deadline and ATI-TEAS scores are due by August 1.
 - ATI-TEAS exam scores are due by the deadline.
 - Students must be enrolled in final prerequisite courses to petition by the deadline.
 - LPN license verification is needed to petition.
 - ATI-TEAS scores are waived if a student petition with 6-12 months of working as an LPN.
- **The Nursing program has a point system for selecting students.** The Allied Health and Nursing Petitioning Advisors will discuss this with each student.
- **All students who are interested in the Nursing program must major in Health Science A.S. Degree. Do not apply for graduation for this degree.**
- **Students must have an official evaluation completed by Admissions to petition or repetition.**
 - E-mail transfercredit@pgcc.edu to check the status of your official evaluation.
- **All Students must follow current requirements to petition and/or repetition.**
- **BSN Prerequisites:** CHM 1010, NTR 1010, and MAT 1140. Allied Health and Nursing Petitioning Advisors will discuss more.
- All students are solely responsible for meeting their graduation and transfer requirements.
- If accepted into the Nursing Program a mandatory orientation is required if accepted. Failure to attend will jeopardize program enrollment.
