Awarding of Transfer Credits for Non-Credit Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic (EMT-P) Certification

Prince George's Community College will award 38 transfer credits to individuals towards completion of their Associate of Applied Science Degree as an Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic (EMT-P) who have completed an approved EMT-P curriculum and who are certified as a Paramedic by the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians (NREMTP) or have an active state EMT-P license.

<u>Rational</u>: The EMT-P has met the same national standard curriculum as set forth by the United States Department of Transportation/National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. Any individual who completes an approved program is eligible to take the licensing EMT-P exam administered by the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians.
